
Total weight: ca. 500 kg

Set up

The panels (3 mm Dibond) are reinforced on the back side with aluminum angle sections.

The perforated flat sections are attached to steel cables by clamps or picture hooks (provided by the borrower). That is where the panels are mounted.

Free-hanging panels, e.g. from the ceiling, can be attached back to back onto panels of the same size (sandwich).
